HESS LAKE STATUTORY BOARD UPDATE

The Hess Lake Statutory Board (HLB) continues to work with the Brooks Lake Statutory Board (BLB) to manage mutual issues.

Your HLB has completed a water depth measurement and a silt depth measurement. The depth measurements were used to compare with our water and silt measurements done around 1990 and to set a new benchmark for depth measurements that will occur on a schedule recommended by the engineering firm, Spicer Group, who did the measuring. Spicer was chosen because of their award winning lead engineer's expertise in lake management, and that they had worked with Brooks Lake recently, giving them a familiarity with Hess Lake. We found that there are no drastic changes in water depth. Some of the deeper areas lost a small bit of depth, but shallower areas gained a bit of depth. This information is encouraging. One interesting bit of information is that the silt study seems to indicate that some of the silt is more like a clay inorganic soil rather than vegetative detritus. At this point we don't have all the information that the water and silt measurements have produced. We will report on this at a later date.

The water and silt depth map will be posted soon on the Hess Lake Improvement Association (HLIA) website. We also have available a letter from the DNRE on a fairly recent study of Largemouth Bass and Carp that indicates these Hess Lake fish do not exhibit any harmful chemicals or substances in their sample tissues. Largemouth Bass were tested because they are a predator sport fish (eat other fish) while carp are bottom feeding scavengers. Testing both types of fish gives a better picture of the health of the lake fishery.

HLB is nearing completion of our Hess Lake information booklet. When completed, the booklet will be provided to all residents of the HLB assessment district. There will be a great deal of interesting, informative and historical information in this booklet.

HLB budget and assessment for 2011 will be put together in September and that information will be included in the next HLIA newsletter. We've had good results with our weed control this year. We'll be making plans with our lake vegetation manager in September so that we'll be prepared for next year.

The clarity of the lake has been better this year, even though we've had a lot of hot sunny days. A possible explanation for this is that we have had good control of the exotic, invasive weeds and dropped them early in the spring for at least four years and there has not been a large decomposing biomass on the lake bottom in the fall and winter which contributes to silt buildup and nutrient loading. Dense algae blooms have not been as evident, though in the spring the trees drop a good deal of pollen, which has been mistaken for algae.

The recent Voluntary Shoreline Restoration Program (creating native plant buffer areas) was well received by Brooks and Hess Lake residents this past spring and the previous fall. The HLB's partner in this program, the Muskegon River Watershed Assembly (MRWA), was able to obtain some additional funding from the Fremont Area Community Foundation which will be used initially to start a similar program for Fremont Lake (Spring 2011 planting). There may be resources available to conduct another program for Brooks/Hess Lakes during fall 2011 or sometime during 2012 (to be determined). Stay tuned for further updates.

I have been in contact with a licensed trapper who will come to your residence and set traps to catch these invaders. Trapping season starts in November and if you grant him your permission to access your property, his service will be free of charge. Otherwise he charges \$10 per animal. He does not use any foot trap's, just the under-water barrel type trap.
