We are sponsoring our 3rd annual Carp Round Up. Every evening from 7:00-8:00 beginning May 22 through June 12, we will collect and count the carp you catch in Hess Lake. There will be three prizes for the most carp. Brooks Lake is doing a carp round up at the same time. You can sign up for either lake but participate in only one. We will be paying \$150, \$100 and \$50 for top three who catch the most. We will be using the same collection site as 2015. The site is on thw south end of Hess Lake. Come to the intersection of Hess Lake Dr and 100th St. east of the Wheeler Bridge and watch for the CARP SIGN. Go south on 100th and follow the signs.

The paperwork is being processed and proper permits obtained to complete a Goose Round Up. We need everyone's help to locate the nesting sights of the geese. There is a \$50.00 bounty on each nest found. So get out, take a walk. If you see a nest call Denny Brown at 616-801-3670. After the eggs hatch there is very little that can be done to control them. The 2016 Goose Round Up will depend upon the DNR ruling on Bird Flu. The plan is to do a round up if possible.

Please continue to dispose of the leaves properly and please <u>do not</u> dispose of your leaves into the lake. The leaves will decompose and create food for weeds and algae. Also, <u>do not</u> put leaves and clippings along the road or in drainage ditches.



HESS LAKE STATUTORY BOARD (HLB) REPORT

Last year there were fewer treatments for weeds because the milfoil (non-native plant) has disappeared. The DNR is directing to not treat for native plants as they will help enable the fish population to grow again. The HLB is also discussing the treatment for algae blooms since these blooms are so transient. It is \$6000 per treatment and the treatment is only effective for 24 hours. The algae then returns. There was discussion about the amount of foam last year on the lake. It is caused by phosphorus that comes from detergents, fertilizers, and septic systems. It was requested that we ask residents to use phosphorus free detergent be put on the sign at the Boat Launch.
